#### GOVERNMENT HANDS OVER 64 NHE HOUSES IN ONDANGWA

ONDANGWA- The Executive Director of the Ministry of Urban and Rural Development Mr. Nghidinua Daniel, officiated the handover of 64 National Housing Enterprise (NHE) houses in Ondangwa, on 06 March 2025.

Mr. Daniel, speaking on behalf of the Minister of Urban and Rural Development, Hon. Erastus Uutoni, highlighted the government's unwavering commitment to housing as a key national development priority. He stressed the importance of housing in reducing poverty, promoting social cohesion, supporting economic growth, and ensuring political stability in the country.

Speaking at the same event, Ondangwa Mayor His Worship Councillor Paavo Amwele, reaffirmed the local authority's dedication to ensuring that residents have access to affordable housing and land.

"I promised you that we would give NHE some serviced plots so they can continue constructing houses, and we did that. Today, we are here witnessing this kept promise." He stated.



On her part, the Chairperson of the NHE Board of Directors, Ms. Toska Sem acknowledged the timely completion of the project. She noted that the initiative is in direct response to the increasing demand for improved housing and better service delivery. Ms. Sem emphasised that local authorities need to continue expanding housing efforts to keep up with the growing rural-to-urban migration.

"The NHE has adopted a drastic approach to increase the annual housing output in urban centres to ensure that the national housing backlog is reduced significantly for the benefit of all Namibians," she said.

The NHE has an ongoing construction of 52 houses in Okakarara, 34 in Mariental, 171 in Nkurenkuru and 546 in Katima Mulilo.

**NKURENKURU-** The Governor of Kavango West, Hon. Sirkka Ausiku, officially inaugurated an expohall, an open market, and a fire station in Nkurenkuru on 05 March 2025.

The Minister of Urban and Rural Development, Hon. Erastus Uutoni, in a speech delivered on his behalf by Hon. Ausiku said the facilities mark a significant step towards the town's urban and economic development.

Hon. Uutoni highlighted that the open market will provide a safe and clean environment for vendors to conduct their businesses, the expo hall will serve as a hub for businesses, investors and local entrepreneurs to showcase their products and services and the fire station will enhance the town's capacity to fight and rescue lives and properties from fire. He commended the Nkurenkuru Town Council for successfully completing these projects and emphasised that such developments play a crucial role in sustainable urban growth, economic expansion, and improved community well-being.

"These newly inaugurated facilities align with our national goals of decentralisation, economic diversification, and inclusive development," Minister Uutoni stated.

Speaking at the same event, Nkurenkuru Mayor, His Worship Councillor Jafet Muti, highlighted the significance of the projects in shaping the town's future.

"These developments symbolise our vision of Nkurenkuru as a centre of culture, commerce, and community engagement," he said.







#### NHE FINANCES SOAR AFTER YEARS OF STRUGGLES

**WINDHOEK-** The National Housing Enterprise (NHE) has recorded a profit of N\$6 million in 2024, a significant improvement from the previous year when it recorded a loss of N\$46 million. The milestone was celebrated at the Annual General Meeting (AGM) held in Windhoek on Friday, 14 March 2025.

In his address, the Minister of Urban and Rural Development, Hon. Erastus Uutoni, praised the NHE board of directors and the management team, noting their efforts in ensuring that they are up-to-date with audits, successfully presenting annual reports, and holding Annual General Meetings. He acknowledged that after years of financial struggles, NHE is now stable financially.

"Realising a profit is surely an indication that effort has been made to put NHE in a financially sound position. After many years of being in the negatives, at least now financial prudence is starting to show," said the Minister.

Hon. Uutoni took note of the challenges faced by NHE, including loan repayment and affordability by the low-income earners stating that the government has revised the National Housing Policy, in order to prioritise the low-income groups. He urged the entity to adopt innovative strategies to address the surging housing backlog.

Meanwhile, the chairperson for the NHE Board of Directors, Mrs. Toska Sem presented the directors report and officially handed over the 2023/2024 annual report to the Minister.

Speaking at the same event, the Deputy Executive Director of Finance and Public Enterprises Mrs. Louise Shixwameni said, despite NHE's achievements and great improvement, challenges still lies ahead. She stressed that NHE must innovate and increase its annual target in order to deliver on their mandate.

NHE Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Mr. Gisbertus Mukulu stated that the achievements have fuelled their resolve to administer the much needed impact to the Namibian population through the provision of affordable housing.

"We take full cognisance of the noble task bestowed on us as NHE and the amount of work required to fulfil this particular mandate. As daunting as it is, it our conviction that we will overcome, given the positive trajectory we have embraced especially over the past three years," the CEO stated.
